The Miami Beach Surf Life Saving Club was officially formed on 16th March 1947 and founded by six men from Southport SLSC. Another five men joined the first Bronze squad, run over the Easter weekend of 1947, to bring Miami's first season membership to a total of 11. They are the foundation members. The Miami surf club has grown significantly since then, from a timber shack supporting 10, to a cohort of 600 who recently celebrated its 70th Anniversary. Miami has always been one of the smaller clubs on the Gold Coast, and one with a proud history of cultivating a family-oriented environment. Its no-gaming-machine policy has enabled the club to focus, fully, on its members and is one of the reasons that our Nipper program is so strong. The club, in the last 10 years, has seen only 175 rescues, yet over 9,000 preventative actions and this is a testament to the calibre of lifesavers who call the Miami Beach Surf Life Saving Club their home.







### TREASURER'S REPORT

The Surf Club remains in a strong position after another successful year, on the beach and financially. The Graph below shows the major financial aggregates since 2014-15 with indicative figures for the coming year. The bottom line "at the bank" is an increase of \$23,389 to put our end of year balance at \$166,303. Of this \$49,735 is now in a building development term deposit ("BUILD") and I recommend we add \$37,000 this year to further build funds for much-needed Clubhouse development.



In 2018-19 and rounding numbers, income realised of \$239, 000 was down by \$12, 500 from the previous year. This was largely a result of the \$17,000 one-off government ski grant in the previous year and \$5,400 less in membership fees principally due to Nipper numbers returning to more normal levels after an unexpected big jump the previous year. Additional funds from fundraising, rents and other sources compensated for half of the income drop we would have otherwise experienced.

As anticipated and omitting depreciation, operating expenses rose \$24,000 to \$198,000 largely due to \$12,000 in extra Carnival fees as members competed more actively – and successfully - in a range of events along with an extra \$12,000 spent on needed grounds works. \$7,000 less in Nipper expenses was the most outstanding of several areas of expense reductions. The net operating surplus of \$41,000 becomes the reported accounting loss of \$6,000 after allowing \$49,000 for depreciation and an additional \$2,000 in clothing stocks.

We do have our challenges in financing the coming year, and years. Members make a major financial contribution, as do sponsors and government as acknowledged elsewhere in the report. Many individual and community member contributions also deserve acknowledgment. Each in their own way is supporting the very active development of members' skills and the financial and other capacities of the Club so we can continue saving lives and enhancing safety on Miami Beach.

The great efforts of Robyn in the office and of all those volunteering to do their bit for the club must be applauded. We build on many efforts over the years which have played their part in our current financial and other successes.

As mentioned previously, increasing Club activities mean we have begun to take a fresh look at further Club House development. The Building Committee and Executive have had some preliminary discussions on possibilities - and your thoughts and other inputs will soon be sought. This year we are setting a funding goal, and the sooner we can meet it... well that depends on you too!

Again, to everyone who contributed to the many successes of the Miami Beach Surf Life Saving Club, a very big Thank You! And to you too, as you contribute in the coming year as well!

### **CLUB CAPTAIN'S REPORT**

What a great season we have had again! We have been blessed with almost perfect weather and conditions for much of the season. Patrol numbers remained strong throughout, with only a couple of patrols falling short and requiring assistance. Top effort by all; you have certainly made my second season as club captain a breeze!



Following such a great season, I would like to extend my thanks to all those members who made my job as Club Captain hassle-free. I truly appreciate every single one of your efforts throughout the season. I would like to thank my team of patrol captains; they have helped ensure that the season ran smoothly by working with all our patrolling members to meet our obligations. Also, a special thank you to all members who volunteered for our Christmas Day patrol. This was our only non-rostered patrol for the season, and I appreciate the time given up by members to ensure that our beach could open.

At the beginning of the season we were successful in gaining 2 grants: the first was the Queensland Fire & Emergency Services Lifesaving Services Development Fund Sustainability and extension of services grant (QFES) which enabled us to stock up on patrol uniforms (shirts and shorts) and obtain 9 new life jackets; the 2nd grant was the Beach Safety Equipment Fund (BSEF) grant. This grant enabled us to purchase a new IRB motor, patrol wide brim hats, patrol caps, bum bags, whistles and binoculars. All this equipment is vital in helping us keep our beaches safe. If you notice, or have any suggestions for, equipment that needs upgrading for next season please let me or a member of the management committee know.

In February we had a resuscitation which happened during the early hours of a Sunday morning. The resus occurred at approximately 05:45 after a member of Miami, Graham Huband, ran to the club and informed some other members (Zachary Henwood, Oliver Henwood, Dylan Chapman and Alan Hobbs) who were about to commence a training session. Graham had noticed a member of the public performing what looked like CPR on a male surfer unconscious on the beach between Riviera Road and Santa Monica Boulevarde avenues (approximately 500m north of the Surf Club). All 5 members then loaded the ATV with the necessary equipment and went to help. They reached the patient and, working as a team, they each assumed the necessary roles. CPR was conducted immediately, the Oxy-Viva was introduced and the defib was attached. No shock was advised so they continued with CPR and oxygen for 15-20 minutes until QAS arrived and took over. Top effort by all involved.

Club Championships was later this season and despite them being in the April school holidays, we still had a successful turn-out. A great morning was had by all with some impressive skills on show. We also had some awesome results from members who attended the State and Australian titles. Finally, the Captains Keg was held in May. This was again a great night and was well attended.

I'd like to finish by thanking the management committee, especially my Vice Club Captain Harrison Henwood, for all their help and support throughout the season and wish everyone a safe and relaxing break. I hope to see you all back for another season of patrolling this coming September.

With more coaches, we aim to give better coaching to more members and bring specialist coaches where we may see the need. This season, we had Julian Norton-Smith offer his services for a very reasonable cost. The members involved reported a major improvement in their paddling. # INFLATABLE RESCUE BOAT (IRB) RACING

Before I begin, I would like to extend a huge thank you to Queensland Jet Ski Spares for sponsoring our IRB Team with not only precision work on our propellers, but a facelift to our cowlings. They look amazing.

In May 2018, the ocean becomes a roar with Clubs on the SE coast revving their motors and racing through the surf in the Ocean Roar Series. Competition is tight and there is no room for error as surf rescue boats negotiate the surf, round a turning buoy, pick up their patient and return to shore in a fast and sometimes furious race. There are 5 rounds to the Ocean Roar Series and Clubs travelled from Coolangatta to Rainbow Beach to compete. In comparison to other Clubs, our Miami



Team is small. And with 18 Clubs competing for the number 1 spot, Miami Beach consistently progressed from heats to finals and proudly positioned 4<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> in the Handicap and Overall Point-scores.

Motors were then fine-tuned for the next leg of our racing season: the 2018 QLD IRB Championships held at Kurrawa SLSC from Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> June – Sunday 24<sup>th</sup> June. Surf was up and our team raced strong. At the end of the weekend, Team Miami had brought home 3 silver & 2 bronze medals as well as placing an outstanding 4<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> in the Handicap and Overall Point-scores.

The 2018 Australian IRB Championships, or better known as "Aussies", saw Team Miami pile into Henwood Tours and motor 15 hours south along the east coast of Australia to a small beach-town called Thirroul. With boats in tow, the bus echoed with music, chatter & operatic arias. Surf conditions on day 1 were deemed too dangerous, with 6- to 8-foot waves pounding the shore, and the safety committee had no choice but to cancel the first day's racing. Day 2 began, conditions were rough, and racing was suspended until further notice. Lunch time came and the safety committee opened the beach to a modified program of racing and all teams were cautioned to drive with their safety-cap on. Boats soared high as both driver and crewie locked in and punched through the waves in a race to pick up their patient and return to shore. We survived day 2 and on day 3 (the finals day), we raced our way into the finals in challenging conditions.

# **POOL RESCUE**

This season, Miami SLSC added another string to the lifesaving sports bow with a few members taking the first steps as competitors in the Pool Rescue Season on offer by SLSQ. Congratulations to Halley Asquith, Tayah Cooper and Dylan Chapman for taking up the challenge and competing in two of the rescue events on offer - the Gold Coast Pool Rescue Championships and the Queensland Pool Rescue Championships.

Competitors test their rescue skills with events such as manikin tows, obstacle swims and tube swims carrying patients. The event has expanded to include under-11, under-12 and under-13 athletes, and it is hoped the efforts from these members will encourage youngsters into the sport and maintain their involvement in lifesaving, whether in the pool or in the surf.

The interest and level of entries in pool rescue competition has grown from strength to strength in recent years, particularly in the younger age groups and will only grow in status, especially with the high level of international competition provided by the traditional European nations of Germany, Italy, France, Spain and Great Britain.

It is also considered an essential aspect for athletes to have pool rescue skills among their credentials for consideration to be selected for Australian teams, enhancing the importance of this competition in rounding out a competitor's skill set.



#### Miami Beach Surf Life Saving Club Notes to the Financial Statements For the Year ended 30 April 2019

#### 1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

#### (a) Basis of Preparation

The financial statements are special purpose financial statements prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act (QLD) . The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historic costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

#### (b) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

#### (c) Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured.

#### (d) Employee Benefits

Provision is made for the association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee benefits have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled, plus related on-costs.

#### (e) Property, Plant and Equipment

Property, plant and equipment are carried at cost, independent or committees' valuation. All assets excluding freehold land, are depreciated over their useful lives to the association. Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

#### (f) Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost of inventory is determined using the first in first out basis and are net of any rebates and discounts received.

#### (g) Leases

#### Finance Leases

Leases of fixed assets where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset, but not the legal ownership that are transferred to the association are classified as finance leases.

Finance leases are capitalised by recording an asset and a liability at the lower of the amounts equal to the fair value of the leased property or the present value of the minimum lease payments, including any guaranteed residual values. Lease payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the lease interest expense for the period.

Leased assets are depreciated on a straight-line basis over their estimated useful lives where it is likely that the association will obtain ownership of the asset or over the term of the lease.

#### (h) Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is recognised when the amount of the revenue can be measured reliably, it is probable that economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the entity and specific criteria relating to the type of revenue as noted below, has been satisfied. Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable and is presented net of returns, discounts and rebates.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

#### Sale of Goods

Revenue is recognised on transfer of goods to the customer as this is deemed to be the point in time when risks and rewards are transferred and there is no longer any ownership or effective control over the goods.

#### (i) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). In these circumstances, the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense.

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the statement of financial position.

#### 1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

#### (a) Basis of Preparation

The financial statements are special purpose financial statements prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act (QLD) . The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historic costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

#### (b) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

#### (c) Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured.

#### (d) Employee Benefits

Provision is made for the association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee benefits have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled, plus related on-costs.

#### (e) Property, Plant and Equipment

Property, plant and equipment are carried at cost, independent or committees' valuation. All assets excluding freehold land, are depreciated over their useful lives to the association. Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

#### (f) Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost of inventory is determined using the first in first out basis and are net of any rebates and discounts received.

#### (g) Leases

#### Finance Leases

Leases of fixed assets where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset, but not the legal ownership that are transferred to the association are classified as finance leases.

Finance leases are capitalised by recording an asset and a liability at the lower of the amounts equal to the fair value of the leased property or the present value of the minimum lease payments, including any guaranteed residual values. Lease payments are allocated betweenthe reduction of the lease liability and the lease interest expense for the period.

Leased assets are depreciated on a straight-line basis over their estimated useful lives where it is likely that the association will obtain ownership of the asset or over the term of the lease.

#### (h) Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is recognised when the amount of the revenue can be measured reliably, it is probable that economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the entity and specific criteria relating to the type of revenue as noted below, has been satisfied. Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable and is presented net of returns, discounts and rebates.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

#### Sale of Goods

Revenue is recognised on transfer of goods to the customer as this is deemed to be the point in time when risks and rewards are transferred and there is no longer any ownership or effective control over the goods.

#### (i) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). In these circumstances, the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense.

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the statement of financial position.
